1. Lay out all of your supplies.



2. Pour the sand evenly into the bottom of the terrarium globe and arrange the decorative pebbles around the edges.



Form the piece of moss to the shape and size of your liking and place it to one side.



4. Place your air plant in the sand next to the moss in the terrarium.

Ta-da! You're done!



Plant Care DO'S AND DON'TS

DO:

- Water your air plant 2-3 times a week by submerging it in water for 5-10 minutes, shaking the excess water off, and placing it out to dry before repositioning it in the terrarium globe.
- When displaying indoors, place your air plant in a well-ventilated area with indirect sunlight.
- When displaying outdoors, place your air plant in partial morning or afternoon sun.
- Fertilize occasionally using a bromeliad fertilizer found in most garden centers.

DON'T:

- Don't use softened or distilled water. Filtered or rainwater is best.
- Don't place your air plant in direct sunlight or next to a window.
- To avoid rot, don't keep plants constantly moist or wet.
