Local History Collection Mission

The purpose of the Henderson Libraries Local History Collection is to preserve the history of Henderson, Nevada and provide access of historical materials to residents, students, and scholars. Henderson Libraries seeks to provide materials that increase knowledge about family histories, social, physical, economic, and cultural heritage of Henderson. The Local History Collection includes the physical collections housed in the Archives at the Paseo Verde Library branch, and digital formats that are freely accessible through the Digital Collections.

Scope of the Collection

The Local History Collection includes original materials in a variety of formats including, but not limited to, newsletters, newspapers, letters, diaries, pamphlets, posters, scrapbooks, photographs, maps, illustrations, audio and video, microform, and born digital documents (PDF, TIFF, JPEG). The Local History Collection focuses on materials that are related to Henderson's history, mainly focusing on its significant individuals and families, government, social and religious organizations, and families. The geographic scope focuses exclusively on the Henderson area.



Selection Criteria

The Local History Collection focuses on materials that fit the following factors:

- Historic merit and value
- Community request
- Available space to house materials
- Clear copyright
- Cost to process, store, and preserve
- Authentic and completeness of record
- Good condition
- Non-duplication of material within the collection or other institutions
- Lack of restrictions by donor
